



## Call for Papers

The 50th Annual Conference and Exhibition will take place at the Bournemouth International Centre, 13 - 15 June 2019.

The BIALL Conference Committee Call for Papers is out now.

The BIALL 2019 conference theme is ***50 not out: past, present, future.***

To celebrate our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we are seeking presentations that celebrate our past and look to the future, whether in library services, technology, training or the professional role.

We want our delegates to leave the conference with a sense of how the association has grown, and how it will continue to serve our members in providing a forum for discussion of what is on the horizon, and how each sector is dealing with changes in the legal and academic landscape.

We're interested in presentations covering topics such as:

- Digital shift, and how technologies are revolutionising services
- Engagement with our users
- Looking back, how has our profession evolved, and what lessons were learned?
- Insight into the challenges ahead for those working in the information profession

We are especially interested in hearing from first-time presenters, as they are key to the longevity, variety and vibrancy of our conference. A good way to take a first step is to present one of the popular **lightning talks** – a brief talk of no more than 10 minutes.

BIALL can offer plenary and parallel speakers a reduction in the cost of the conference package, or overnight accommodation and attendance at the

conference on the day of their presentation, as well as a contribution to local travel expenses and a modest honorarium. A small reduction on the conference fee is available to lightning talk presenters.

### ***How can I participate?***

We have several options in the conference programme:

#### **Plenary session**

An in- depth presentation on a subject, delivered to a larger audience, of 1 hour including Q&A. Presentation slides or technology tools may accompany your talk.

#### **Parallel session**

Practical sessions to smaller groups, ideally with interactivity or workshop to encourage discussion. Sessions last 1 hour including Q&A. Presentation slides or technology tools may accompany your talk.

#### **Lightning talks**

An informal platform to share new developments, projects or tips, in 10 minutes or less. This is suited for 'how tos', quick case studies, your best practice tips, or innovative ways of using products.

## Turning your idea into a proposal

If you are interested in presenting at the Conference, decide which format you'd prefer (plenary, parallel or lightning session) then fill in the appropriate form. You'll be asked to submit the following information:

### Presentation abstracts

Please include an abstract of 250 - 500 words, outlining your proposed presentation and how it would fit with the conference programme. The abstract will include information on:

- Target audience
- Key learning outcomes delegates will take away
- The style of the session:  
workshop/lecture/case study
- Tools you might use to deliver the session
- How you will engage delegates and maintain interest

### Biography

The abstract should be accompanied by a short biography of 150-200 words, outlining relevant professional experience, publications, and papers delivered at previous conferences, seminars or training events. Submissions for plenary sessions should specifically include details of previous speaking experience at similar conferences.
